

# Database Search Criteria

Mathematical Criteria		
>	More Than or After	> <b>100</b> for example
<	Less Than or Before	< <b>100</b> for example
>=	More Than or Equal To	>= <b>100</b> for example
<=	Less Than or Equal To	<= <b>100</b> for example

Logical Operators	
<b>Between And</b>	<b>Between 1980 And 2000</b> for example
<b>Or</b>	<b>January Or April</b> for example
<b>Not</b>	Used to exclude data – <b>Not 2000</b> for example

Like Criteria	
<b>Like * *</b>	Contains the words..... - <b>Like *kite*</b> for example
<b>Like a*</b>	Fields <b>starting with a</b> for example
<b>Like *a</b>	Fields <b>ending with a</b> for example

Finding fields with no data	
<b>Null</b>	Used to display fields that contain <b>no data</b>

Searching fields that contain a certain number of characters	
<b>"?????"</b>	Used to search fields for <b>particular number of characters</b> (in this case 5)  <b>NOTE:</b> This is the <b>only criteria</b> where you have to <b>type in the quotation marks</b> (" ") yourself. For the other criteria you should let Access add the quotation marks for you.
